

STEVE NELSON graduated from Albert Lea High School in 1988 where he lettered in baseball and hockey. He was the captain of the hockey team his senior year and earned All-Conference honors for his junior and senior seasons. After completing high school, he was drafted by the Junior A North Iowa Huskies of the USHL.
